SHORE TRAINING FACILITIES

1. Introduction

Shore facilities are designed to support the sea training requirement using simulation equipment. If training facilities are to be beneficial to all, it is essential that they be fully used, to assist seagoing personnel in meeting the CBRNDC challenge, in whatever shape or form that challenge may present itself.

2. MWS Phoenix Training Group (TG) (The School Of Maritime Survivability)

- a. **Courses.** Detailed information on all of the courses conducted by Phoenix Training Group are detailed in the annual DIN '**Joining Instructions for Personnel Attending Maritime Warfare School Courses at MWS PHOENIX TG, HMS Excellent**'.
- b. **Joining Instructions.** The annual DIN is to be made available to all students prior to departure from their parent unit. It is most important that questions and queries are to be resolved direct with the Group Warrant Officer (Ext 93832 7037) MWS Phoenix TG before students depart from their parent unit.
- c. **Course Booking.** Places on CBRN and Damage Control courses are booked via the Central Course Booking Cell (93825 4085). Personnel drafted to PJTs are booked through appointers, CMs and WMOs. Requests for short notice bookings will not be considered unless operational necessity dictates.
- d. **Ships Team Training Booking.** Dates for Ship Team training courses are promulgated by an annual RNTM and are to be booked via the Central Course Booking Cell (93825 4085).

3. HMS RALEIGH

- a. **Courses.** Detailed information on all of the courses conducted by Triumph CBRNDC School are detailed in the annual DIN '**Joining Instructions for Personnel Attending CBRNDC Courses at Triumph Squadron, HMS Raleigh**'.
- b. **Joining Instructions.** The annual DIN is to be made available to all students prior to departure from their parent unit. It is most important that questions and queries are to be resolved direct with Triumph Squadron (9375 41333/41612) HMS RALEIGH before students depart from their parent unit.
- c. **Course Booking.** Places on CBRN and Damage Control courses are booked via the Central Course Booking Cell (93825 4085). Personnel drafted to PJTs are booked through appointers, CMs and WMOs. Requests for short notice bookings will not be considered unless operational necessity dictates.
- d. **Ships Team Training Booking.** Dates for Ship Team training courses are promulgated by an annual RNTM and are to be booked via the Central Course Booking Cell (93825 4085).

4. Linwood Fire Fighting Training Centre

- a. **Introduction.** A firefighting training service for submarine personnel based in Scotland is provided at the Linwood Fire Fighting Training Centre, Unit 2, Imperial Business Park, West Avenue, Paisley, PA1 2FB.
- b. **Course Bookings.** Ship Team Training is to be booked by e-mail as detailed in the Annual RNTM released prior to the start of the training year (Apr-Apr) by MWS Phoenix TG.

5. HMS SULTAN

- a. **CBRN Training for Air Engineering Personnel.** DCAE (Gosport) is responsible for the training of TEM 76 (Aircraft Decontamination). This is taught to personnel nominated to be part of the decontamination teams at Air Stations, Small Ships' Flights or part of Naval Air Squadrons.
- b. **Aircrew IPE Training.** Training in the use of aircrew IPE, including personal fitting of AR5 respirators, is carried out in the Survival Equipment Section.

6. RNAS CULDROSE

- a. **General.** The Royal Naval School of Flight Deck Operations (RNSFDO), RNAS CULDROSE, provides training, principally for personnel of the Aircraft Handling Branch, that includes Aircraft Crash Rescue (ACR) and domestic and structural firefighting. The school also encompasses a Motor Transport Training Division that offers emergency fire appliance driving tuition amongst its full spectrum of driving qualifications. In addition, RNSFDO operates Single Spot Operations (SSO), the department, specialises in the training of Probationary Flight Deck Officers (PFDO) and flight deck personnel for Single Spot Flight Decks (Air 232/233). The RNSFDO comprises a large administration block including external classrooms, fire grounds utilising the latest technology in hot fire training simulation and a fully working flight deck (HMS SISKIN).
- b. **Joining Instructions.** A DIN is promulgated annually that contains all course criteria and dates of courses to be conducted at RNSFDO. The DIN is generally available approximately 6 months in advance of the start of the new training year. Annexed within the current DIN RN is the joining instructions for all students attending courses at RNSFDO.

7. Defence CBRN Centre (DCBRNC) Winterbourne Gunner

- a. **General.** The Defence CBRN Centre (DCBRNC) is a 140 hectare site located at Winterbourne Gunner to the north of Salisbury. The role of DCBRNC is to provide:
 - (1) Tri-Service CBRN Defence training for operations on land.
 - (2) The development and provision of joint-Service CBRN defence doctrine on behalf of the Joint Doctrine and Concepts Centre (JDCC).
 - (3) The management of non-JDCC sponsored specialist joint-Service CBRN defence publications and posters.

(4) The planning, management, recording and analysis of non-technical trials of CBRN defence equipment and procedures.

b. **Joining Instructions.** Joining instructions are supplied to all students attending courses at DCBRNC, including road and rail transport information. Course dates are promulgated by annual DIN.
